Introduction

We are pleased to present the 2022 census digest for Catholic education in Wales.

This year, the census digests for England and Wales coincide with the 175th anniversary of the Catholic Education Service, which we have been delighted to celebrate. Additionally, for the ninth year in a row the return rate for our census has been 100%. This means that the CES census remains the most accurate report of Catholic education in England and Wales but, also, that we are now able to reflect on almost a decade's worth of precise data.

In Wales, our data this year has shown that the number of pupils in Catholic secondary schools has slightly risen for the third successive year and fallen slightly in primary schools, bringing the total number of pupils educated in the 85 Catholic schools of Wales to 28,315.

The CES would like to thank every Catholic school in Wales for contributing to this year's census, which provides us with the essential data needed to monitor long-term trends in Catholic education. As such, the information is invaluable in our discussions with our government partners, MSs, MPs, local authorities, and the media.

Collating the data is no small undertaking so we would also like to thank Robert Rushworth and Rebekah Hayward for their hard work in the production of this document.






1.2.2 Distribution of size of maintained primary schools (2022)




1.2.3 Average maintained primary size (trends)


2.1 Pupil numbers




2.1.2 Number of pupils in Catholic schools (trends)

2.1.4 Number of pupils in maintained secondary & sixth form colleges (trends)




2.2 Pupil Religion




2.2.2 Percentage of Catholic pupils in maintained schools by phase (trends)




2.2.3 Percentage of Catholic pupils in maintained schools by diocese (2022)



2.2.4 Percentage of Catholic pupils in maintained schools by year group (2022)





2.2.5 Distribution of non-Catholic pupils in maintained schools (2022)




2.2.6 Breakdown of non-Catholic religions

There are 13,992 non-Catholic pupils in maintained schools, just under 50% of the total. 46.3% of non-Catholic pupils are from other Christian denominations. 5.7% are Muslims and 36.8% do not have a religion (no change since 2021). 73.4% of pupils in maintained Catholic schools are Christians and 80% are from a faith background.








2.3 Gender

99% of Catholic schools in both the maintained and independent sector required a school uniform.





2.7.2 Percentage of pupils from minority ethnic groups, maintained schools (trends)



2.8 Free school meals (FSM)


25% of pupils in Catholic primary schools and 22% of pupils in Catholic secondary schools are eligible for free school meals.

Eligibility has risen in recent years because of transitional protection during the introduction of universal credit. Any pupil in receipt of free school meals will continue to be eligible even if their parents cease to be eligible for the qualifying benefit.



There are no Catholic special schools in Wales, therefore we would expect the percentage of pupils with statements to be slightly lower in the Catholic sector.






3.1 Leadership Teams



NPQH is mandatory for new headteachers in Wales.


3.3 Staff Catholicity








